

Parent Survey Results

June 2014

Introduction

From April 30 to June 16, 2014, the Children's Scholarship Fund (CSF) conducted an online parent survey to collect household data and evaluate the level of parental satisfaction with their child's school, satisfaction with the CSF New York scholarship program, and engagement with their child outside the school. In the 2013-2014 school year, CSF New York served nearly 8,300 students, though the survey was only sent to 3,287 parents with active e-mail addresses. Of the 3,287 parents e-mailed, 773 completed the online survey for a total 23.5% response rate. External surveys (e.g. customer satisfaction surveys) generally receive a 10-15% response rate or more on average.


Survey Sample


The survey sample includes families living in all five New York City boroughs and attending 132 of the 216 participating schools (61.1%). All of the respondents were parents whose child or children benefited from a CSF scholarship for at least one year and the responses are reflective of the 2013-2014 school year.




HOUSEHOLD DATA

Of the 773 surveys completed, 755 answered the race/ethnicity question, 745 the single-parent question, and 737 the grandparent question.





of parents report living in a single-parent household




of respondents are grandparents raising a grandchild

SCHOOL FEEDBACK

Of the 773 surveys completed, 733 answered the question: What grade would you give your child's school on the following factors: academic quality, communication, discipline, safety/environment, and teaching values?

(712 out of 773 parents answered this question) of parents report that CSF-provided resources


of parents feel they would not be able to afford private school tuition without a CSF scholarship another 24% said they were "not sure" (725 out of 773 parents answered this question)


of parents toured their child's school before selecting it


total parents report having conversations with their child about what his/her class is learning either almost all the time or frequently
