25 Years of CSF: Marking the Birth of a Revolution

"This year, lawmakers in seven states followed West Virginia and Arizona in creating broadly available education-choice programs. ...These historic changes are the culmination of a national movement that began a quarter-century ago, with the creation of the Children's Scholarship Fund."

So said a recent article in *City Journal* by Dan Lips crediting the founding of Children's Scholarship Fund (CSF) 25 years ago with being the catalyst for the school choice gains we see today.

As Lips notes, when co-founders Ted Forstmann and John Walton launched CSF in June, 1998, they kicked off a movement that saw the parents of 1.25 million children applying for the first 40,000 scholarships. Fast forward to 2023, and CSF has provided scholarships worth \$989 million to more than 200,750 children nationwide.

Currently more than half of all states offer programs that fund children instead of systems, including programs administered by CSF partners in Arkansas, Louisiana, Missouri, Montana, New Hampshire, and Pennsylvania. Amid this progress, CSF continues its work of empowering children with scholarships while also educating our stakeholders about the value educational choice can have on individual lives and society as a whole. For example:

- The **New Hampshire** legislature recently expanded eligibility requirements for its Education Freedom Accounts (EFA) Program, and CSF families provided key testimony to lawmakers (see story below).
- **Pennsylvania**'s Democratic Gov. Josh Shapiro has signaled support for the proposed Lifeline Scholarship Program, which would offer education freedom to families in failing school districts. CSF Philadelphia's Executive Director Keisha Jordan recently applauded the governor's support in a letter in the *Philadelphia Inquirer*.
- CSF of Omaha alumnus Jacob Idra and other CSF of Omaha alumni have been vocal proponents of the recently passed tax credit scholarship program in **Nebraska**.
- In recent months, CSF has been called upon to provide guidance to those launching new or expanded state programs in at least six states.

As Lips concludes, "The national movement that Forstmann and Walton created has gone mainstream."

New Hampshire Expands Eligibility for EFA Program



CSF New Hampshire families and staff joined lawmakers to celebrate with Governor Chris Sununu as he signed a bill expanding eligibility for the New Hampshire Education Freedom Account (EFA) Program, which CSF administers.

Chris Sununu signed into law recently passed legislation expanding eligibility for the Education Freedom Account (EFA) Program, which CSF administers. Now families earning up to 350 percent of the federal poverty level (up from 300 percent) can participate in the program.

During hearings with lawmakers, CSF Scholars and parents provided key testimony about the program's value.

The EFA Program, now only in its second year, has grown to serve 3,300 children, and we anticipate more than 5,000 Granite State children will use EFAs in the 2023-24 school year.

THE CHILDREN'S SCHOLARSHIP FUND provides children of low-income families with tuition assistance in grades K-8, and supports expanding educational opportunities for all children.

ore than 2,400 CSF Scholars nationwide (including 577 students in New York City) graduated from eighth grade over the past few weeks and are preparing for high school. Thousands more CSF alumni have earned their high school diplomas and college degrees this graduation season.

CSF surveys and independent research have shown this year's CSF eighth graders are very likely to go on to graduate from high school on time. For example, last year's CSF New York alumni survey found that 97.8 percent of the alumni graduated on time, compared to New York City's average public school graduation rate of 83.7 percent. Since high school graduation is a key indicator of higher lifetime earnings, better health, and a longer life, that's worth celebrating! Congrats, Class of 2023!
