## **Congratulations, CSF Grads!**

Congratulations to more than 2,900 CSF Scholars nationwide (including more than 500 students in New York City) who graduated eighth grade this spring! Thousands more CSF alumni also celebrated high school and college graduations this season.

Data from CSF's internal surveys and independent research show that CSF alumni are highly likely to graduate from high school on time. For example, last year's CSF New York alumni survey found that 96.2 percent of the CSF cohort graduated on time, compared with 83.7 percent of the city's public school students. Since we know high school graduation is associated with desirable outcomes such as higher lifetime earnings, better health, and a longer life, our hats are off to the Class of 2024!

## **CSF Hosts Largest-Ever Partner Summit**

This March, CSF hosted our annual Partner Summit in New York City, bringing together representatives from CSF's partner programs nationwide as well as other scholarshipgranting and education reform organizations, leading to our largest-ever summit with 95 attendees. The summit theme was "Celebrating Choice and Strategies for Expanding the Education Freedom Movement," many attendees noted and that the summit provided them invaluable networking with opportunities and triggered useful ideas for their organizations.

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## **Donor Spotlight: Jackie and Stephanie Palma**

Sisters Jackie and Stephanie Palma grew up on Long Island with parents who instilled in them the importance of education and giving back. After attending Catholic and public schools, both sisters graduated from Vassar College. Jackie moved to New York after college and joined CSF's Young Leaders Board, serving as its co-chair for many years. Now, she and her fiancé, Elliot Tisdale, are part of CSF's President's Council. Following in Jackie's footsteps, Stephanie is now a Young Leaders Board member. Together, the sisters have run eight half-marathons for CSF, giving and raising an impressive \$20,000. Recently, they shared why CSF's mission inspires them.

*Jackie*: Both Steph and I, from high school on, did a good amount of community-based volunteer work. It was just something we enjoyed doing. It was part of our values. After Vassar, I was trying to figure out how I could keep that aspect of my life active. [A friend] mentioned CSF and it sounded very similar to what I was looking to do post-college, so that was a natural segue into my involvement.

*Stephanie*: Giving back has certainly been part of our education from elementary school through college. The ethos at Vassar was a lot about doing what you can to make the education of those around you even better, whether that was the people sitting next to you in class, or tutoring in the local Poughkeepsie schools. So hearing about CSF through Jackie definitely made me want to become a part of it.

*Jackie*: We both went to the Catholic school in our town. Making sure that those values were being instilled from an early age was important to our parents.

Stephanie: It's worth adding that our parents are both first-generation college students. It's just kind of bred into Jackie and me that it's a gift to be educated, so we've always taken it really seriously. Jackie's toyed with the idea of going to grad school, and I'm going to be pursuing a graduate degree, so it feels like our family is crawling up our country's education ladder.

*Jackie*: Making the decision about what the right academic environment is for their child and who's teaching them is something that every parent should have the right to do.

Stephanie: I think it goes without saying that parents have the best interests of their children in mind.

## **CSF Alumni Travel to Norway for Oslo Freedom Forum**

Two CSF alumni, Isabella Marte and Aziz Oguntade, recently traveled to Oslo, Norway to attend the Oslo Freedom Forum (OFF) as the winners of a CSF alumni essay contest generously sponsored by the Human Rights Foundation (HRF), which hosts the OFF.

For three days, the alumni attended the OFF, which brings together human rights activists and supporters from all over the globe. This year's speakers included the first female Olympic athlete from Afghanistan, Twitter founder Jack Dorsey, and activists fighting authoritarian regimes in Uganda, Russia, China, and many other countries.

Isabella summed up her experience saying, "The Oslo Freedom Forum was very inspiring for a young college student like me. It exposed me to many human rights issues that I would have not been aware of otherwise. My biggest takeaway from the Oslo Freedom Forum is that 'no one is free until everyone is free' and we must continue the pursuit of freedom and justice for all people."


